## Graduating Class of 2003

On June 1, Swarthmore College awarded 368 degrees to 360 graduates. Over one hundred (119) of the students earned Honors, 60 with High Honors, and 12 with Highest Honors. This represents almost a third of the graduates, a proportion that has been consistent for the last few years. (See historical data presented on last page of this summary.)

Consistent with recent years, $54 \%$ of the graduates were women. About $32 \%$ were members of minority groups, and $8 \%$ were non-resident aliens. Well over a third ( $44 \%$ ) of the majors were in the Social Sciences*, $27 \%$ were in the Natural Sciences and Engineering, $24 \%$ were in the Humanities, and $5 \%$ were in interdisciplinary majors.


The Class of 2003 had the option of choosing the "old" or "new" curriculum with respect to concentrations and minors. This is the last class for which concentrations were an option, and the first class for which Minors in Course were an option. Relatively few in the Class of 2003 chose to earn a concentration (18, compared to 43 in the Class of 2002), while course minors proved to be rather popular. One hundred eighty-four students earned 206 minors, 107 in Honors, and 99 in Course.
