## Graduating Class of 2004

On May 30, Swarthmore College awarded 364 degrees to 359 graduates. Over a third of the students earned Honors, 67 with High Honors, and 6 with Highest Honors. This is the highest proportion ever. (See historical data presented on last page of this summary.)

Consistent with recent years, $55 \%$ of the graduates were women. A third ( $33 \%$ ) were members of minority groups, and $8 \%$ were non-resident aliens. Well over a third ( $45 \%$ ) of the majors were in the Social Sciences, $27 \%$ were in the Natural Sciences and Engineering, $22 \%$ were in the Humanities, and $6 \%$ were in interdisciplinary majors.


Last year the Class of 2003 was the last class for which concentrations were an option and the first class for which Minors in Course were an option. One hundred eighty-four students earned 206 minors, 107 in Honors, and 99 in Course. This year in the Class of 2004, 222 students earned 247 minors, 117 in Honors, and 130 in Course.

The proportion of graduating seniors who have studied abroad continues to be between a third and a half. In the Class of 2004, $43 \%$ of the students had studied abroad, compared to $47 \%$ in the Class of 2003.
